ABM PEW REFLECTIONs

Today's gospel sees Jesus healing a woman with a kind of haemorrhagic disease as well as Jairus' daughter who was at the point of death. Jesus tells the woman that her faith has made her whole and he tells Jairus not to fear, but rather, to believe. He says to the girl, Talitha cum – little girl, get up, in Aramaic. That phrase still means the same thing to those who speak Assyrian, otherwise known as neo-Aramaic, in the streets of Fairfield and surrounding suburbs in Sydney. Members of the Assyrian Church of the East, whose historic patriarchate is based in Iraq, now live in significant numbers in Sydney and Melbourne,

- Pray for the Church's healing ministry through the Guild of St Raphael, and though hospitals and clinics throughout the Anglican Communion.
- Give thanks for the witness of St George's College in East Jerusalem, praying that they will be able to withstand the lack of student pilgrims because of their dearth at this time of fighting.

During his earthly ministry, it was not only Jesus' miraculous power that astounded and transformed people, but also his willingness to forgive sins.

Our Sunday services and midweek service of Holy Communion always include a corporate prayer of confession, after which the presiding priest pronounces God's forgiveness of our sins. Yet it is also true that sometimes we benefit from the opportunity to confess privately and specifically those things that trouble our consciences.

Reconciliation of a Penitent, or Confession, is a rite in which anyone who repents of sins may confess them to God in the presence of a priest and receive the assurance of pardon and the grace of absolution.

St Margaret's Church and the Acknowledgement of Country

St Margaret's Church is proud to affirm the Wurrundjeri people as the original inhabitants of the land on which we worship and supports reconciliation with First Nations people.

Two months ago, we introduced some trial changes aimed to support this recognition through acknowledgement of country while ensuring that our services are focussed as an act of worship dedicated to the glory of God. These changes included a visual representation of the acknowledgement before the commencement of services, a verbal acknowledgement conducted on occasions of significance to indigenous Australians and there will be a permanent display of the acknowledgement in the foyer of our church in due time.

While noting that this transition seems to have been well accepted, I understand that parishioners will have different views on this issue. Before finalising these arrangements, could I please ask that you provide **any feedback to me via email by Friday 19th July 2024.**

I thank those parishioners who have already provided comments and, while I recognise that the changes may not accord with individual viewpoints, I welcome the willingness of parishioners to achieve a balance between our role as a worshipping community and showing respect to First Nations people.

News from our midweek Wednesday service.

The Old Testament reading from our service this week was 2 Kings 22.3-13 and 23.1-3.

In short it tells us of King Josiah who was overseeing the restoration of a temple (the house of the Lord). One of the workers found a book; the book of the law (which could be the book of Deuteronomy). The book is then read aloud to the king whom upon hearing the words tore his own clothes in repentance and renewed his covenant with God.

The powerful words of scripture had a life changing impact on the king and also his nation.

Wednesday church had an open discussion about our bible reading practices, our joys and difficulties.

At the end I set us a challenge ...to read the gospels in a month. This is not intending to be a bible study – more of a way to engage with the text and get a sense of their contents and structure.
